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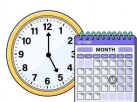
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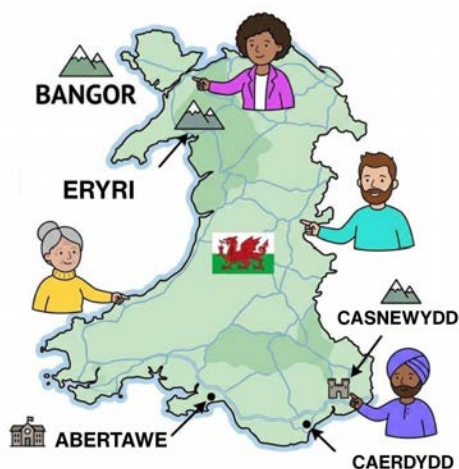

Getting to Plas Glyn-y-Weddw



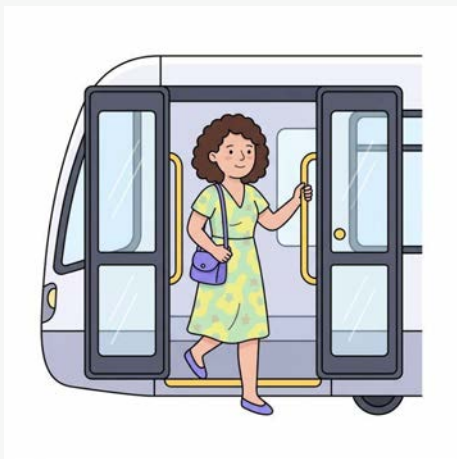
Plas Glyn-y-Weddw supports slow, eco-friendly travel.



The nearest train station is in Pwllheli.

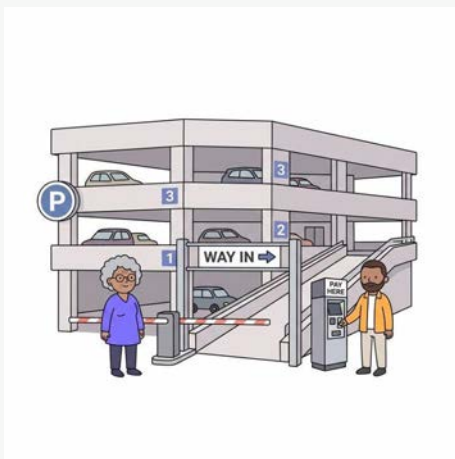


You can take the 17a bus from Pwllheli or Aberdaron.



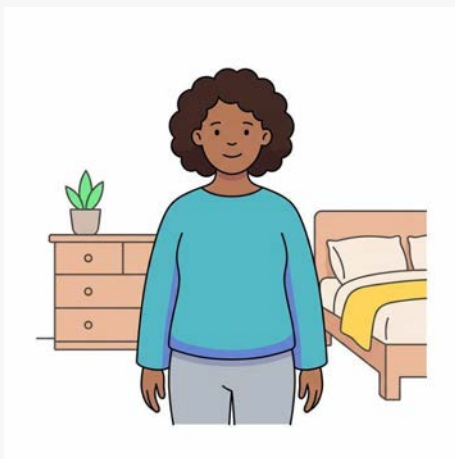
Get off at Llanbedrog Service Station (flat) or Glyn-y-Weddw Arms (steep hill).

Free parking for residency artists



All residency artists can park for free at Plas Glyn-y-Weddw.

Can I bring my family?



Accommodation is ideal for single residents.



The site is not set up for children, but we can help you find childcare.



Your family can visit at the weekend but you must arrange their accommodation.

Can I bring my pet?



Pets are not allowed unless needed for access requirements.

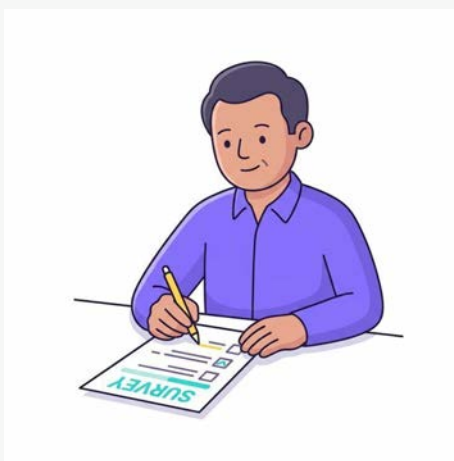
Support for neurodiverse artists

Funding depends on availability and limits.

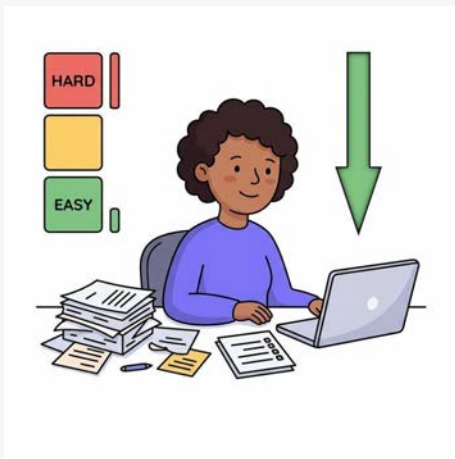


You will complete an Access Statement before your residency.

How we can help you



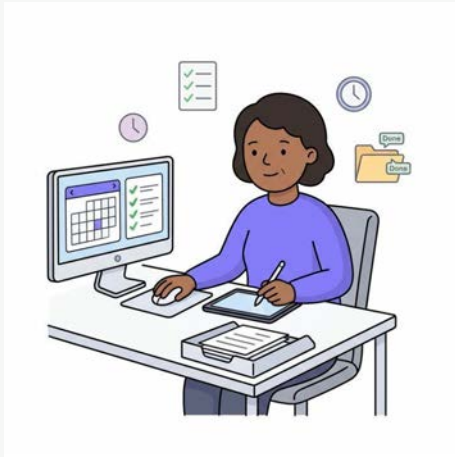
We can support you in ways that meet your needs.

We can also provide noise-cancelling headphones or adjust lighting.

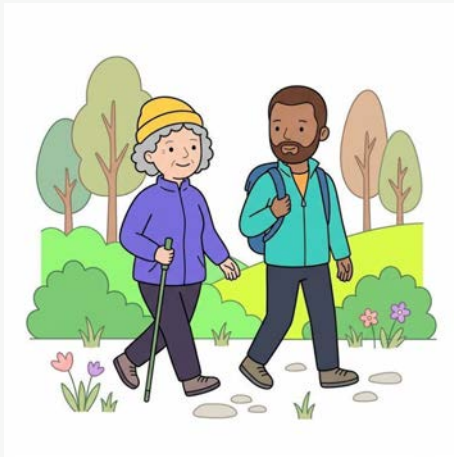


We break tasks into smaller steps and offer flexible timings.

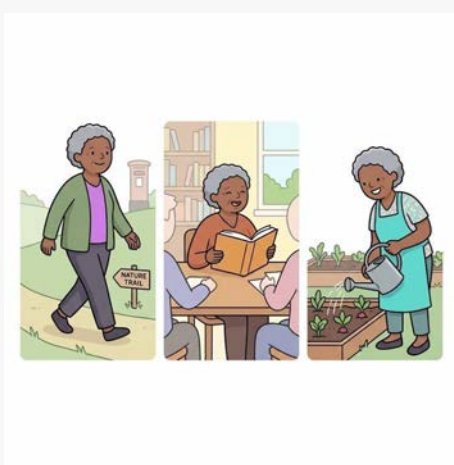
Help for mental health conditions

It has gardens, woodland and access to the Coast Path.

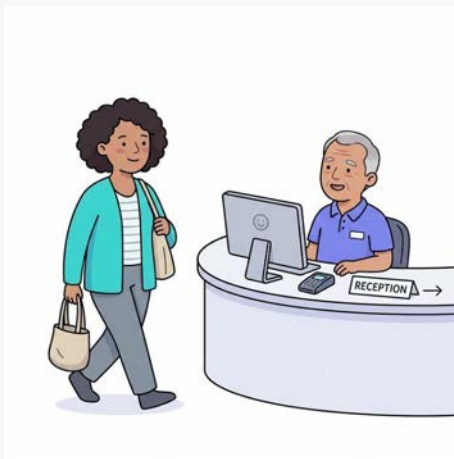


These natural spaces may help with positive mental health.

We can help you make arrangements before your arrival.

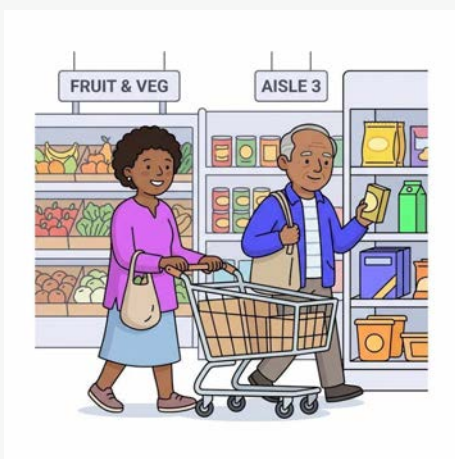
Meals during your residency

There is an electric bike you can use.

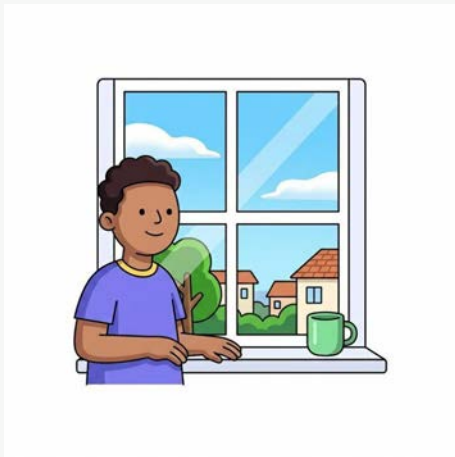


We do not have a car for you to borrow.

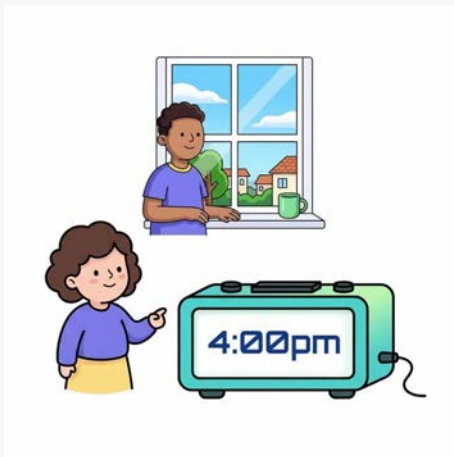


We can help arrange public transport or lifts to certain places.

When Plas Glyn-y-Weddw is open



Plas Glyn-y-Weddw is open every day, 9.30am-5pm (except 25 December 2026 - 22 January 2027).

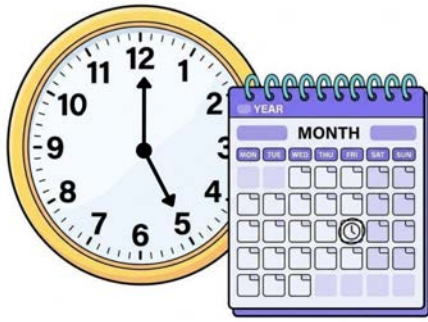


Resident artists should arrive by 4pm to see your accommodation.



Add extra travel time if you use public transport.

When you need to leave



If leaving on Saturday or Sunday, leave by 5pm.



If leaving on a weekday, leave by 10am.

What to bring with you

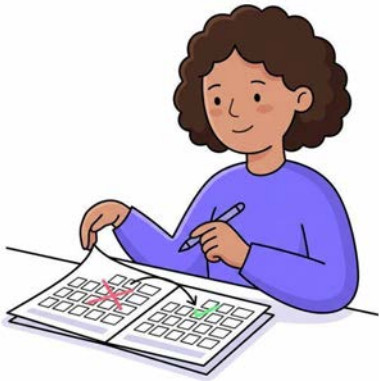


Staff will speak with you about what to bring.



Accommodation has cooking facilities, bedding and towels.

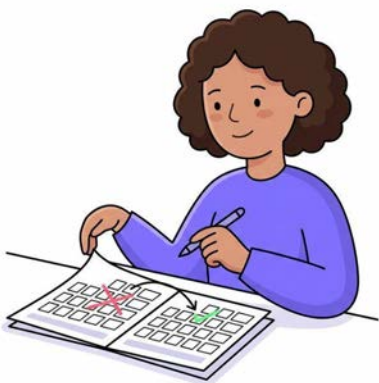
If you have other commitments

We plan residencies to reduce other interruptions.

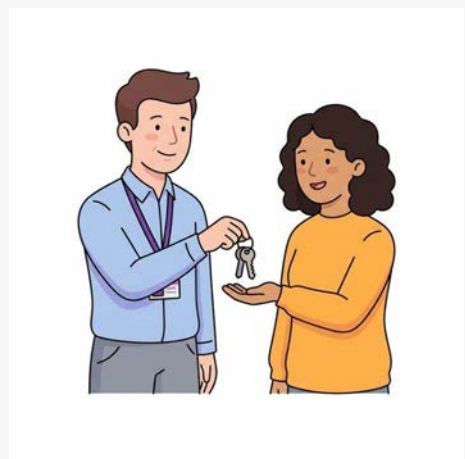


Details are arranged after you are selected.

You can ask about borrowing equipment like a projector.

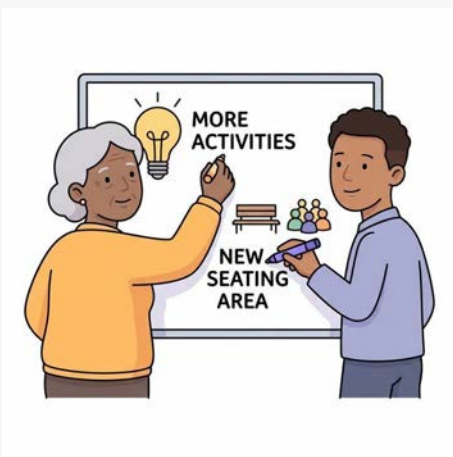


We will decide this with each artist after selection.
